Distance Education

Article 2, Section 55370. Definition and Application.

Distance Education means instruction in which the instructor and student are separated by distance and interact through the assistance of communication technology. All distance education is independent study, and subject to the general requirements of Article 1 as well as the specific requirement of this Article. Provided however, that fully interactive distance education courses, as defined in guidelines adopted by the Chancellor, shall not be considered independent study for purposes of calculating state apportionment pursuant to Section 58003.1. In addition, instruction provided as distance education is subject to the requirements that may be imposed by the Americans with Disabilities Act, (42 U.S. Section 12100 et seq.)

Distance Education, Delayed Interaction (old code 30)

50 = Session under supervision of instructor not available by line of sight using medium where the content varies depending upon student response without the immediate involvement of the instructor (e.g. various types of instructional software, computer assisted instruction (CAI); digitized visual, audio or text selected in response to student input; or specially structured audio tapes, web enhanced television, etc.)

Distance Education, Simultaneous Interaction
